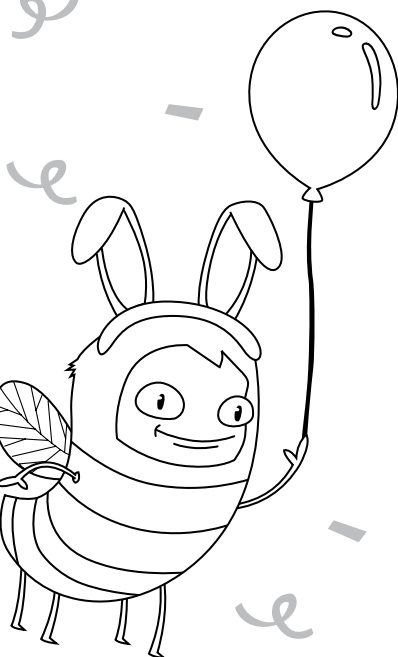
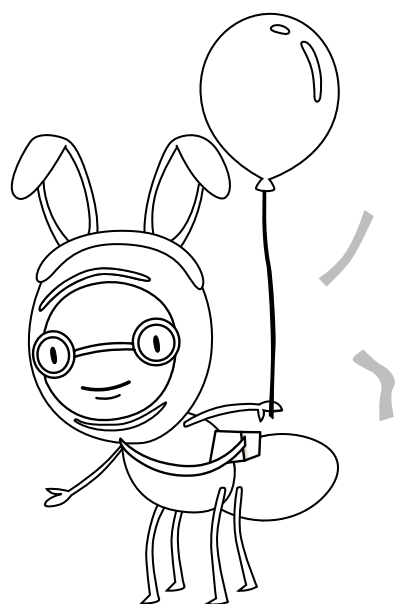

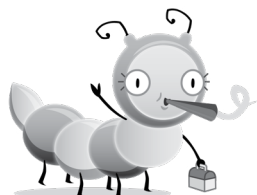
1. Bug Club Bunny Bookmark

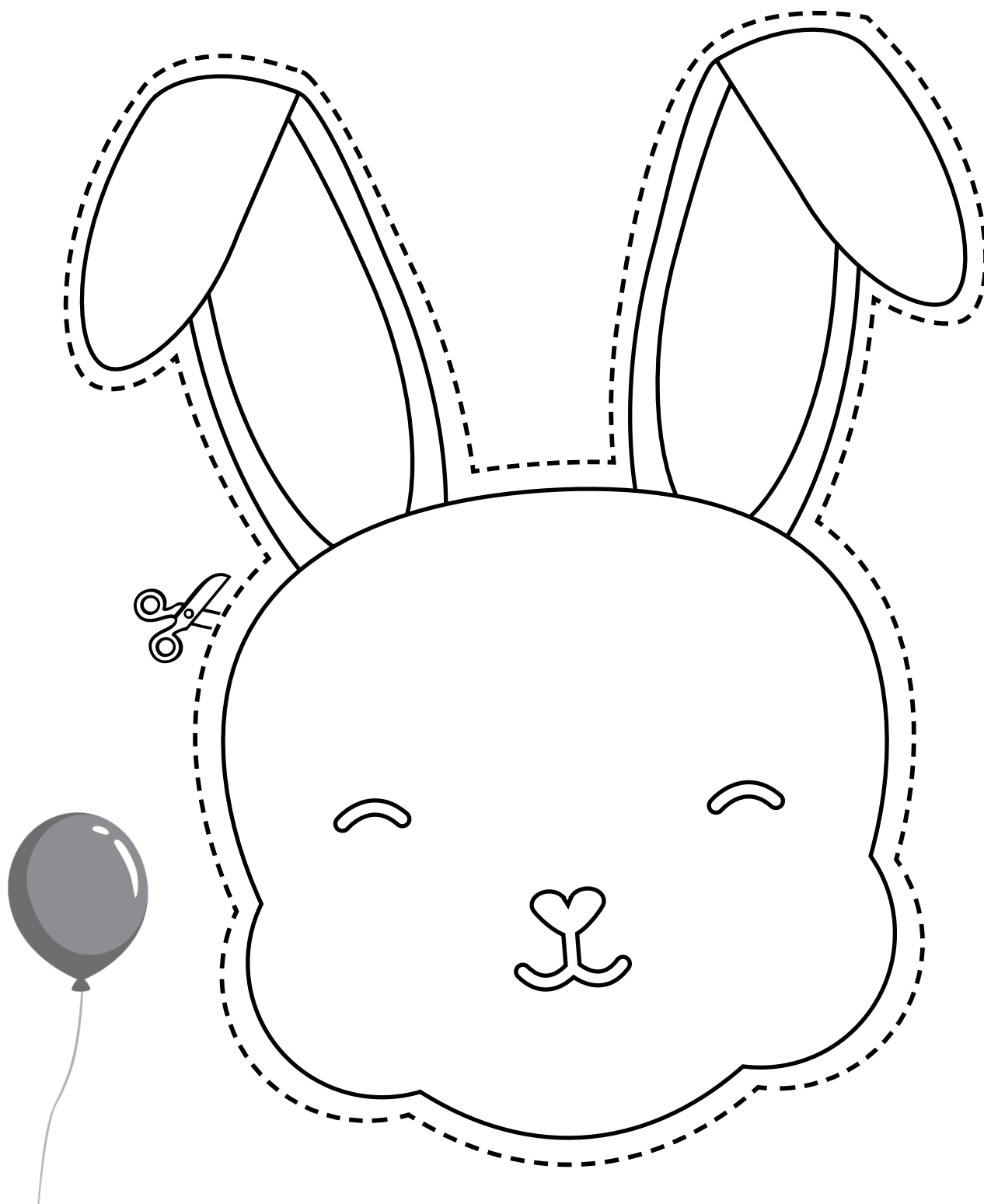


2. Be Your Own Bunny!

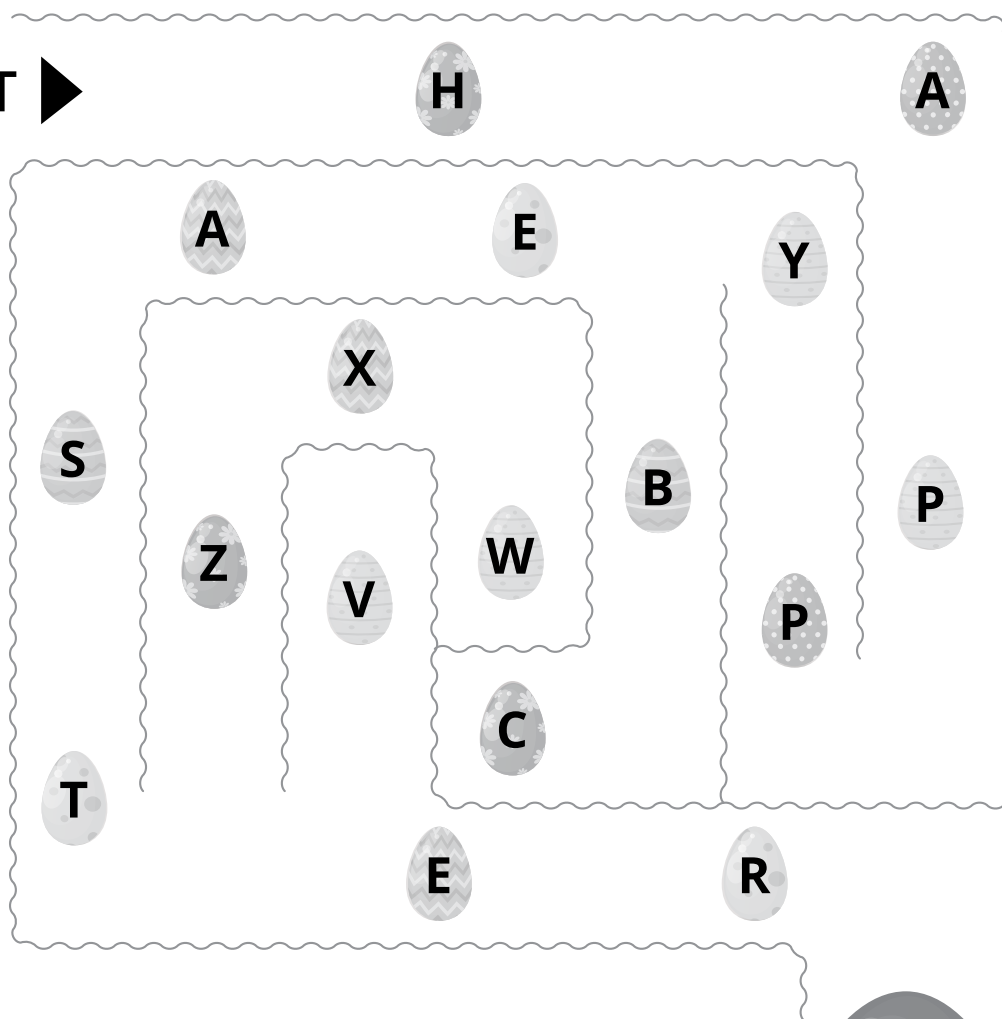


3. The Amaze-ing Egg Hunt

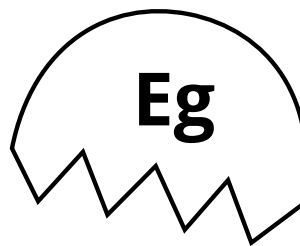
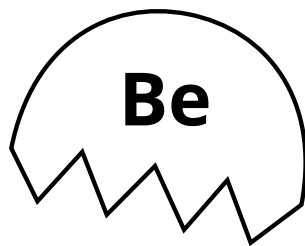
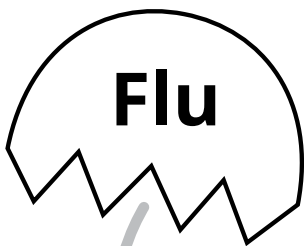
5. Eggs Together

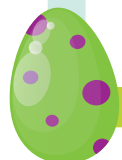

6. Recipe: Crunchy Chocolate Easter Nests

How's about a crunchy Easter treat to eat after lunch or dinner? This recipe makes easy, tasty chocolate nests that don't need to go in the oven. Give it a go and share the results with your friends, or with us by using the hashtag **#EggcellentEaster** on **@PearsonPrimary** !



About 20 minutes preparation and cooking time

Equipment

- One large heatproof bowl for mixing
- One saucepan
- One wooden spoon
- One baking tray lined with baking parchment



Ingredients

- 60g (2.5 oz) of dark chocolate chunks
- 1 tablespoon of melted butter
- 120g (5 oz) of bran flake cereal
- 1 bag of small chocolate eggs to put in your nest

A note about food intolerances:

This recipe can be made **vegan** by using dairy-free dark chocolate chunks and dairy-free chocolate eggs, as well as substituting the melted butter for melted coconut oil. By switching the cereal for a gluten-free alternative, this recipe can also be made **coeliac-friendly**.

What to do

1. Start by washing your hands.
2. Tip a cup's worth of tap water into the saucepan, and heat this until the water is simmering. It is important that you ask for the help of a grown-up to do this.
3. Put the dark chocolate and the melted butter in your mixing bowl, and carefully rest the bowl above the simmering water. The heat of the water will gradually melt the chocolate.
4. When the chocolate and butter mix is fully melted, ask your grown-up to help you take the bowl off the saucepan, and switch off the heat.
5. Stir the cereal into the melted mixture using a wooden spoon. Do your best to make sure every flake has a chocolate coating.
6. Using your spoon, shape the chocolate cereal mixture into 8 nests on the parchment of your baking tray.
7. Gently press the top of each nest with the back of the spoon to make a small dip. This is where your small chocolate eggs can go when the nests are ready.
8. Place your completed nests in the fridge and leave them there to cool for between 45 minutes and one hour.
9. Once your nests feel hard to the touch, take them out of the fridge, and decorate each one with 2-4 of your chocolate eggs...
10. and they're ready. Happy munching!
