Drama activities in school – warm up games – name game and clapping game (pass round circle)

Make me a... (freeze frames of different relationships) In pairs make a parent and child, a master and servant, two brothers etc.

Twins - Find your 'twin' in silence in response to ... Find the person with eye colour the most like yours, same size palm as yours, eyebrows most like yours, most similar nose to your own etc.

THURSDAY

Read the school story book of The Comedy of Errors.

Start to understand the story events

Act out parts of it.

Read the character facts for one character.

Create a statue with one person as the 'director/sculpturer' who explains it when it is shared with the class.

At home, complete the elevator tasks based on the class reading text.

FRIDAY

Reflect on characters from yesterday.

Who are the most important characters for the plot?

Who is the story about?

Who are the most important characters for comic value?

Write about the character from yesterday including their feelings and actions.

LO To write a character description for the character you used yesterday

Proof read for spelling, grammar and punctuation errors
