

CHARACTER STATUES

SOLINUS	• Duke of Ephesus. • Casts judgement on criminal activity and the behaviour of the citizens • Grants Egeon a day to find the money to pay for his fine <i>If any Syracusian born Come to the bay of Ephesus, he dies</i>
EGEON	• Father of the Antipholus twins • Separated from one of his sons and his wife in a shipwreck • Has lived in Syracuse since the shipwreck • Arrested on arrival in Ephesus for being a citizen of Syracuse • Has a wife called Emilia whom he has not seen since the shipwreck <i>Proceed, Solinus, to procure my fall, And by the doom of death end woes and all.</i>
ANTIPHOLUS OF EPHEBUS	• One of a pair of twins, separated at sea. • Has a servant called Dromio • Landed in Ephesus with his mother after the shipwreck • Married to Adriana • Lives with his wife and her sister Luciana and Dromio • Is friends with the Courtesan <i>I pray you, to the Porpentine, That chain will I bestow Be it for nothing but to spite my wife - Upon my hostess there.</i>
ANTIPHOLUS OF SYRACUSE	• One of a pair of twins, separated at sea. • Has a servant called Dromio • Landed in Syracuse with his father after the shipwreck • Has been looking for his brother since his 18th birthday. • Falls in love with Luciana <i>I to the world am a drop of water That in the ocean seeks another drop</i>
DROMIO OF EPHEBUS	• One of a pair of twin servants, separated at sea. • Has a master called Antipholus • Is beaten for the mistakes he makes • Landed in Ephesus with Antipholus • Has a girlfriend called Nell who works in the kitchen • Lives with Antipholus, Adriana and her sister Luciana

	<i>I have served him from the hour of my nativity to this instant, and have nothing at his hands for my service but blows.</i>
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DROMIO OF SYRACUSE	• One of a pair of twin servants separated at sea • Has a Master called Antipholus • Is beaten for the mistakes he makes • Has been travelling with Antipholus to help find his brother • Landed in Syracuse after the shipwreck • Is mistaken for his twin by Nell, his brother's girlfriend <i>I am an ass, I am a woman's man and besides myself</i>
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BALTHAZAR	• Is owed money by Angelo the goldsmith • Is promised the money after Antipholus pays for the chain. • Suggests that Antipholus goes to the pub when he gets locked out of his house <i>Depart in patience, And let us to the Tiger all to dinner,</i>
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ANGELO	• Making the chain for Antipholus of Ephesus • Owes Balthazar money • Witnesses Antipholus of Ephesus getting locked out of his house • Gives the chain to the wrong Antipholus <i>Here's the note How much your chain weighs to the utmost carat, The fineness of the gold, and chargeful fashion, Which doth amount to three odd ducats more</i>
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EMILIA	• Wife of Egeon • Since being separated in the shipwreck has lived like an Abbess in Ephesus <i>Thirty-three years have I but gone in travail Of you my sons, and till this present hour My heavy burden ne'er delivered.</i>
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ADRIANA	• Antipholus of Ephesus' wife • Promised a gold chain • Fed up because her husband is always back late from the market <i>Neither my husband nor the slave returned, That in such haste I sent to seek his master? Sure Luciana, it is two o'clock.</i>
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LUCIANA	• Adriana's sister • Has to calm her sister down when she gets upset because Antipholus is late • Stands up for her sister in front of Antipholus
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
