Background			
School-led tutoring is part of the National Tutoring Programme (NTP) in 2023-2024. State-funded schools will receive a ring-fenced grant to source their own tutoring provision for disadvantaged and vulnerable children who have gaps in learning which is (in part) a legacy of the COVID-19 pandemic. Disruptions have resulted in significant missed education by pupils; disadvantaged and vulnerable pupils have been particularly impacted. Tutoring is one of the most effective tools for helping pupils recover lost education and many pupils have already benefitted this year from the NTP. The government is offering schools a new, expanded tutoring offer from the start of the academic year 2023-2024.

Third Space Learning (<i>online maths tuition x one session per week</i>): Impact: targeted children in Y4,5	➤ Children identified to participate in this project will receive individual tuition (online) to improve maths skills and confidence ➤ Standards of mathematics improves	£4,162 (15 children)	Children will improve their confidence and skills in mathematics by participating in this online tuition. We expect to continue to provide this support in subsequent years.
To close gaps in learning between current and expected standards for individuals			
Provide children with high quality intervention / catch-up learning to close gaps to their peers (<i>one focussed session per week</i>): Impact: targeted children in KS1 & Lower KS2	➤ Data has shown that standards in KS1 & Lower KS2 require the most attention from a catch-up perspective ➤ Individually, children will receive the catch-up tuition they require from a qualified teacher ➤ Tuition will be reviewed on a half termly basis and subsequent needs considered	£1,373 (5 children)	Children in KS1 & Lower KS2 begin to close gaps in their learning which are (in part) a legacy of the COVID-19 pandemic. Support will continue for as long as required.
NB: Whilst many of our highly focused short term initiatives have been designed to show rapid success, a number of our initiatives are designed to be 'cumulative in their impact', ie, they will show significant impact over time and across many aspects of the child's life.
