

# Our Oceans

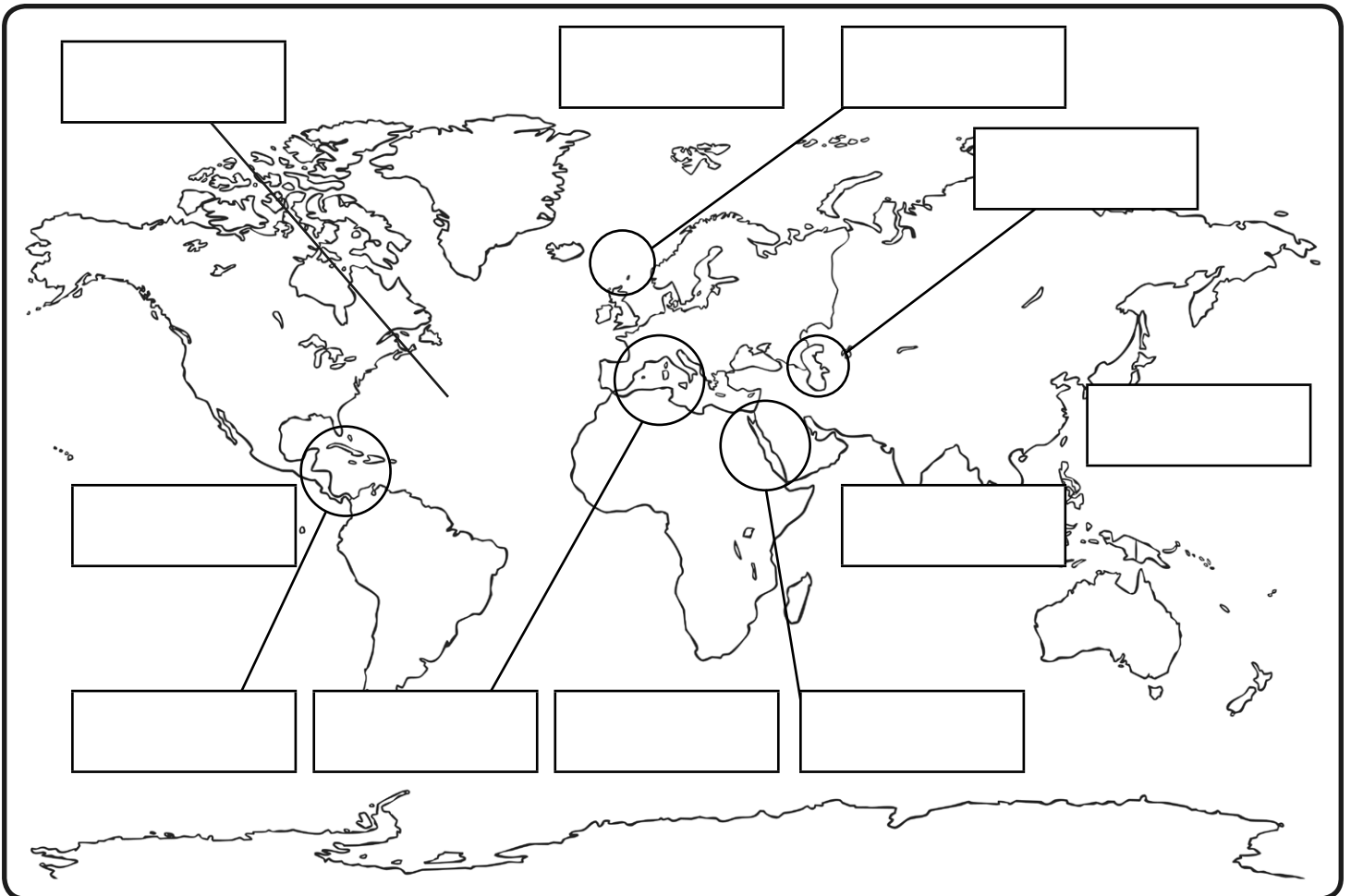
As the Earth spins around, there is a viewpoint from space where all you can see is Pacific Ocean.
