

Afternoon task – 5.7.21

Monday	Science L.O: To explore some of the ways in which flowering plants disperse their seeds. Can you order the stages of the life cycle of flowering plants? How do plants disperse their seeds? Can humans disperse seeds from plants? Complete worksheet. RE Watch the KS2 BBC Bitesize clip <i>The festival of Vaisakhi</i> and study images of Vaisakhi celebrations. Write notes about what you can see and any questions that they would like answering about Vaisakhi. Tuesday	Topic L.O: The Domesday Book Look at the extract from the Domesday Book. Can you translate it into modern English? Use a dictionary to help. What questions would the Commissioners have had to ask to get the information they needed? For example: – How much land do you own? – How many cattle do you have? – What is your job? Complete your own household survey. Using the results, create a bar chart to show the types of houses each child lives in. French Salut – Sport Lesson 4 – complete the two worksheets.
Wednesday iPads	L.O: To discover names and jobs from the past. Use online tools, such as The National Archives, to locate places mentioned in the Domesday Book. Find out if place names close to school or home have changed since 1086. Make a list of common names and occupations of the time and consider how these would be different if the survey was taken today.
Thursday	Computing L.O: To carry out a class survey and record information using graphs, tables or bar charts. Carry out a class survey of life today, in the style of the Domesday Book. Ask questions, such as ‘Where do you live? What animals do you keep? What hobbies do you have? What types of music do you listen to? Friday	TOPIC L.O: Plan and design a castle Work in groups to study a map of your local area. Find an ideal location for Alfred’s castle. What physical features will help protect his family from the angry Saxons? Use the web to collect example Norman castle designs and create a photo montage. Make sure your ideas match Alfred’s brief.

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Invent new ways to keep attackers out of the castle and Alfred's family safe inside. What about a raging moat of fire or an incredibly tall keep? Let your imagination run wild, sketching out your ideas.
