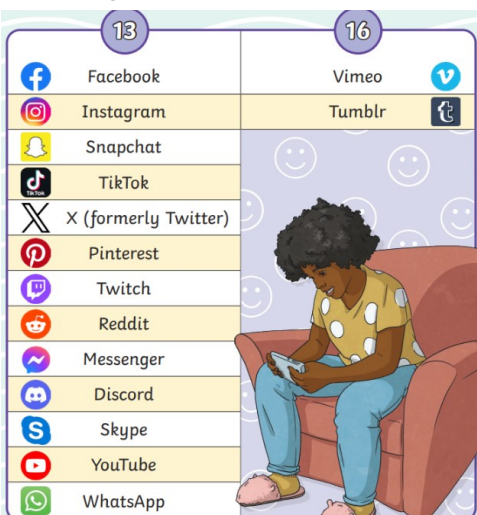

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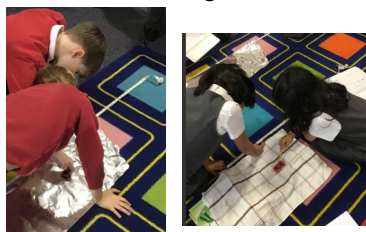
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Bishopton Science Week

Year 3 used their investigation skills to see which material caused the most and least friction. By rolling cars down a ramp and measuring how far the car travelled. They also learnt how closely linked science and maths are when they used their knowledge of measurement to record their findings.



Celebrating British Science week has been an exciting opportunity to inspire curiosity and a love of learning. Throughout the week, pupils have taken part in a variety of hands-on experiments, science investigations, and creative challenges that encourage them to ask questions and explore how the world works. Amongst other things, many year groups have participated in live lessons from the likes of the BBC, Year 6 have been dissecting hearts, year 4 have set up an investigation to see which liquids cause tooth decay and year 1 are exploring the question 'do beans need water to grow?' We're excited to see the results!

By linking science to real life and making learning fun, British Science Week helps children develop important skills like teamwork, problem solving, and critical thinking, while showing them that science is all around them.

Year 6 were treated to a 'hands on' guided tour to the digestive track, heart and lungs.

They explored the four chambers of the heart, identified the heart strings and major vessels entering the heart. Pupils also explored the structure of the lungs.



Our Reception children explored the exciting topic of dinosaurs.

Children explored where the dinosaurs lived their habitats and why the only living dinosaur left is Mrs Charman (only joking). The children talked about why dinosaurs disappeared. They even got to see a erupting volcano!
